

A Guide to... Revision


In the last week of each half-term, all students at Oasis Academy South Bank complete Post-Unit Assessments in all of their subjects. These assessments review the learning that has taken place in each subject for each half-term. Students should be completing independent revision at home in order to learn the knowledge and skills required for each assessment in order to reach their target. This email summarises some ways that you can support your child with revision at home.



Assessments at OASB

We ensure there is a rigorous focus on regular meaningful assessments in all subject areas so students and parents are consistently aware of student progress and how to move forward.

Teachers at Oasis Academy South Bank provide students with lots of materials to use at home in order to revise - and most of these require no computer or internet access! You will find below a summary of OASB's revision resources and materials and how they can be used effectively at home.



Look - Cover - Write - Check

Look - Cover - Write - Check is the best way for students to learn, revise and test themselves on information and knowledge. Here's a summary of how students should complete look-cover-write-check at home and how you can ensure they are doing it correctly.

Look – at small section (read it over and over in your head)

Cover - one side you have been reading and copying

Write - as much as you can remember of the whole section without looking back

Check - with green pen to ensure 100% accuracy – spellings, order of words. Each time there is a mistake or spelling mistake - test again

After students have completed this process for a whole knowledge organiser, you can <u>test them on the content</u> and see how much they can remember! For example...

Parent: What is the nuclear model?

Child: I don't know


Parent: The nuclear model is... Repeat that back to me now.

Child: The nuclear model is...

Parent: I'll come back to that question at the end to see if you can remember...

Why revision? Why Knowledge?

Unless knowledge is regularly reviewed, it will be forgotten. In order to be successful in GCSEs, students need to remember 1000s of bits of information - for each subject! We want to make this easier for students by helping them to start learning all of this information sooner.

Quizlet is a website that lets you test yourself on knowledge that you have been learning/revising. Students can create an account and upload information on to Quizlet to test themselves on. Lots of teachers have also made quizzes on Quizlet that students can use to revise from.

Good strategies for learning at home:

It is a good idea to take phones and laptops away from students while they are completing revision to avoid easy distractions.

Even if children say they have 'no homework' they can always complete useful revision using the Knowledge Organisers - it is a good idea to set a timer for 30 minutes while they are doing revision or homework after school and then they can relax afterwards!
