Unifrog will allow students to research future colleges or universities for when they leave OASB as well as providing information on subjects and careers to aspire to.

It would if you as a parent/guardian could take some time to explore future careers and education opportunities with your child.

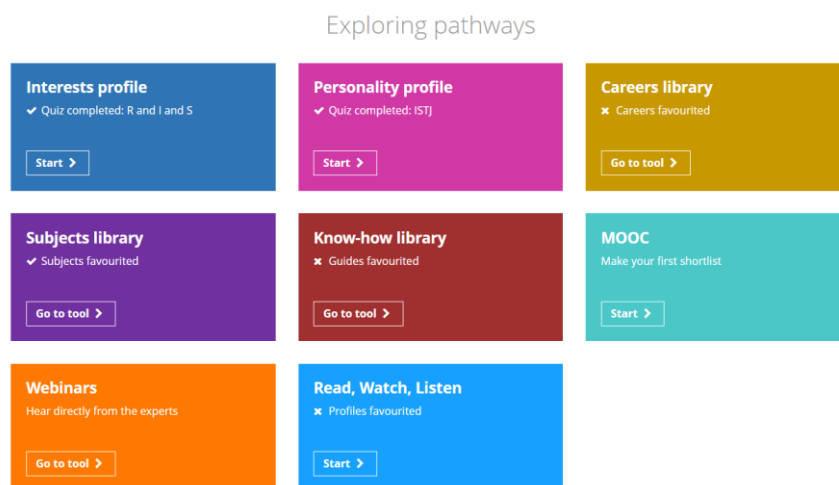
Logging in

1. Go to - www.unifrog.org and sign in.
2. Students login with their OASB email (@oasissouthbank.org)
3. Students check their Outlook for their password or click reset password if forgotten.

Exploring careers and pathways

Unifrog has lots of tools available to help students become more informed about their next steps.

1. Quizzes – Unifrog suggests careers and subjects based on a student’s interest and personality.
2. Libraries – students are able to search and save information about careers, subjects and skills.
3. Online learning – articles, courses, videos are available to provide an introduction on an area of interest.

Unifrog has information on universities, colleges, and course across the UK and Internationally. Students can

1. Research and compare universities, colleges and apprenticeships courses that are offered locally or nationally.
2. View information on college/university (number of pupils, rating, etc.)
