



Warfare was important to the lifestyle of the Plains Indians because it meant they could steal horses. This was important because they it meant they could hunt the buffalo more easily. More specifically, they could ride after the herd and kill the buffalo with their bow and arrow. +Horses were also important for the Indians nomadic lifestyle. +More specifically, they used the horses to move around the Great Plains, pulling all their possessions on a travois. • 50%-Second paragraph. This may not be included in the bullet points <p>The origin of migration west 1835-61 was the Oregon Trail set up by Mountain Men. This led to, many Mountain Men travelling West to hunt bear and beaver, for their fur. The fur was sent back east and turned into coats and hats.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 50% second paragraph. Describe how the first cause links to the next cause <p>This links to the Mormons going west in 1849 because the Mormons suffered persecution in the East due to their belief in a third book of the bible, the Book of Mormon, that Joseph Smith said he discovered on some golden plates in his back garden. This led to all the Mormons moving west along the Oregon Trail and setting up Salt Lake City in Utah</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 60%. Third paragraph. Describe how the previous causes link to the third cause <p>+This links to the idea of Manifest Destiny because both were religious reasons why people migrated west. Manifest Destiny was the idea that it was God's will for white Americans to migrate west and control the entire north American continent. The idea was popularised by the media in the East. Repeat for a second consequence.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st consequence: One consequence was tribes to the east of the frontier had to move west onto the Great Plains. This was because the land to the east of the frontier was for whites and to the west of the frontier for Indians +This meant that the Crow and Seminole tribes were forced to move onto the Great Plains. This was called 'the Trail of Tears' • 2nd consequence: Another consequence was increased competition for resources on the Great Plains This was because more tribes were using the same amount of land, water and buffalo. +This meant that conflict between tribes increased, particularly between the Crow and Sioux. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.
